 - Micronutrient Upper Tolerances – Glenn Murray
 - Dioxin/furans analysis – waste derived products – analysis still expensive so limit testing to high risk products. Companies registering products containing materials at risk for Dioxin/Furan contamination required to submit results of analysis from accredited laboratory along with results of the typically required pathogen and heavy metals analysis.
 - Metals analysis – cheap so more analytes can be tested for.
 - Waste/Recycled Materials – emerging contamination risks
 - Simons – Concrete Road grinding in proposed in Washington. Has Canada looked at these materials?
 - Murray – No but I would expect similar issues to the cement kiln dust, along with some potential for additional pollutants due to exposure to transport.

 - Ron Alexander – Phosphate – nutrient restrictions. Water extractable phosphorus test. Should we be allowing water extractable phosphorus results on the label? Issues with mobility of phosphorus in the soil and contamination of the environment.
